WHEREAS the LADWP has not implemented Motion #09-0652, as proposed by Perry, Garcetti and Greuel, to establish a Community Solar Outreach Plan; and,

PROPOSED MOTION:

1. The Public Safety Committee is authorized to designate any Neighborhood Watch organization located in Greater Valley Glen as a GVGC Participating Neighborhood Watch provided that the Neighborhood Watch:
 - a) Encourages members of the local Neighborhood Watch to allow their e-mail addresses to be used by the GVGC e-mail Address List; and passes around an e-mail list for their members to sign onto the GVGC e-mail Address List;
 - b) Invites the GVGC President or designee and GVGC Public Safety Chair or designee to speak at their various events including their National Night Out program;
 - c) Agrees to participate on the GVGC Public Safety Committee by sending an observer to its meetings;
2. The Public Safety Committee is authorized to grant an amount not to exceed \$250 to GVGC Participating Neighborhood Watches for use for paying for actually incurred expenses for National Night Out Programs to be held on or about August 4, 2009; provided that:
 - a) The GVGC Public Safety Committee has designated the Neighborhood Watch as a GVGC Participating Neighborhood Watch;

- b) The expenses are allowable expenses as designated by the GVGC Public Safety Committee;
 - c) Invoices are submitted for actually incurred expenses on a form acceptable to the GVGC Treasurer;
 - d) The invoices cover items such as food, plates, tableware, table clothes, etc. actually used for the local Neighborhood Watches National Night Out Program;
3. The total amount authorized for the National Night Out Program shall not exceed \$2500;
4. In addition, the GVGC Public Safety Committee is authorized to spend an amount that shall not exceed \$1950 for customized Neighborhood Watch stickers for home or business windows.
